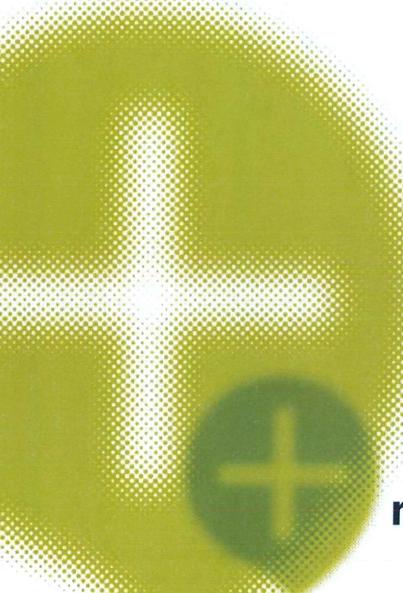

Entity's Purpose or Mission

To create, nurture and maintain a world-class recreational trail network that connects our communities, is sustainable, integrated, well utilised and highly regarded, that enhance the health, wellbeing and quality of life of all Wakatipu residents and that attracts visitors from around the world.

Entity Structure

Volunteer Board comprising Chairman, Deputy Chairman, two patrons, five further trustees and a representative from QLDC. Executive comprising one full time CEO, one full time Projects and Marketing Co-Ordinator and one part-time Partnerships Co-Ordinator.

Entity's governance arrangements

The Trust is governed by a board of trustees that makes key decisions. The board consists of no fewer than 6 and no more than 12 trustees. The board may, by a majority vote, appoint new trustees from time to time, selected upon the skill set requirements of the board. The board and the executive team meet bi-monthly.

Entity's Reliance on volunteers and donated goods or services

We utilise a volunteer Board of Trustees, rely on volunteer support for associated events that generate revenue for the Trust, and we engage with value in kind to support trail development and maintenance.

Medium to long term objectives

Queenstown Trails seeks to 'inspire adventures, create experiences and connect people' through a sustainable network of world-class and connected recreational, backcountry and commuter trails, as described in our Strategic Plan 'The Next Ten Years of Queenstown Trails 2023-2033'.

Our goals are to expand and develop regional trail connections with other Great Rides, ensuring collaboration and joint benefits with other trail entities. These connections will provide access for landscape-scale restoration projects, where trails are just one part of picture to include removal of invasive species, native forest restoration and predator control.

Additionally, we will continue to advocate for more commuter routes for our growing community, and work alongside NZTA to facilitate an improved active transport network, allowing people to get out of their cars and onto trails to make their daily commute to school, work or play, reducing congestion and improving the health and wellbeing of our community.

Key Activities

The past 12 months has seen the successful opening of both the Wharehuanui Trail (17km) and Shotover Gorge Trail (7km), marking the completion of the Queenstown Trail Realignment Project.

These trails were made possible through the MBIE Great Rides Enhance and Expansion fund, Central Lakes Trust and generous donations from philanthropist donors. The trails have been extremely well received by the community and visitors, particularly the Hugo Tunnel and Kimi-ākau bridge which attracted over 25,000 users in their first 3 months of operation.

The new trails have enabled extensive-replanting projects to be realised, with particular mention to the Te Whaka-ata a Haki-te-kura /Mill Creek catchment by Mana Tāhuna and the Slopehill Reserve by the Whakatipu Reforestation Trust. Additional collaborations with the Whakatipu Wildlife Trust have seen the deployment of new trapping lines and trail cameras for the effective control of predators.

Closer to home, we have also been focussed on an integrated active transport network, particularly in the southern corridor where rapid residential development has overwhelmed the existing transport infrastructure. Queenstown Trails has stepped in to progress the long-awaited link from Jacks Point to Frankton, having secured initial funding, negotiated easement agreements and lodged consent applications to allow the route to happen.



The community benefit is also realised by events like the Queenstown Marathon and Motatapu amongst others, which we support with use of the trails, course enhancements and a volunteer database to enable the events to run smoothly. We're very fortunate to have such professional event delivery teams who recognise benefits of the world-class trail network to host their races, and who want to give back to ensure their long-term sustainability

Through working 'better together' with events, partners, and other local trail entities, our region continues to bolster its cycle tourism offering, with a connection from the Queenstown Trails into the Central Otago Trails through the Kawarau Gorge to be completed in 2026. High-level planning and feasibility studies have also commenced for trail options linking Queenstown to communities in the South and West, which will only continue to support our regions reputation and ensure the future success of the Queenstown Trails.

Additional Output Measures

3.91% increase in use of trails: 419,150 total Trail Journeys (1,613,729 unmoderated) (year ended June 2024: 403,366 moderated / 1,552,961 unmoderated). *Note – Frankton Track counter is paused for 2024-25 due to sewer upgrade works.

30% increase in Website users: 97,537 at end of June 2024 (2024: 75,089)

44% increase in Facebook followers: 9,378 at end of June 2025 (2024: 6,519)

Statement of Accounting Policies

Queenstown Trails Trust For the year ended 30 June 2025

Basis of preparation

This performance report is prepared in accordance with the XRB's Tier 3 (NFP) Standard. The Queenstown Trails Trust is eligible to apply these requirements as it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of less than \$5,000,000. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. This performance report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate for the foreseeable future.

Treatment of GST

All amounts are recorded on a GST exclusive basis, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST

Queenstown Trails Trust is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Cash and short term deposits in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous performance report.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific policies which materially affect the measurement of the Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Financial Position have been applied.

1. Revenue Recognition

Donations are recorded when they are received.

Grant revenue is recognised when the conditions attached to the grant has been complied with. Where there are unfulfilled conditions attaching to the grant, the amount relating to the unfulfilled condition is recognised as a liability.

Sales of goods and services are recognised at the time when the Trust sells a good or service to a customer.

Interest income is recognised as it is earned during the financial year.





2. Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is recognised at cost less aggregate depreciation. Historical cost includes expenditure directly attributable to the acquisition of assets, and includes the cost of replacements that are eligible for capitalisation when these are incurred

All other repairs and maintenance are recognised as expenses in the Statement of Financial Performance in the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposal of fixed assets are taken into account in determining the net result for the year.

3. Wakatipu Community Foundation Endowment Funds

The entity has an endowment fund with Wakatipu Community Foundation. The entity considers it controls the funds and that future economic benefits from the funds are probable, therefore the funds are recorded as an asset.

The funds must remain invested for a minimum of five years, and the entity may receive grants of income after the funds reach \$50,000, and/or grants of capital after five years. Therefore, the funds are currently recorded as non-current.

The funds are recorded at cost, being the historical contributions of the entity and donations by third parties to the endowment fund, less any impairment. Interest and dividend income are recognised as earned or when dividends are declared. Unrealised increases in fair value of assets within the funds are not recognised until realised (i.e. sold). Donations to the Wakatipu Community Foundation for administration of the funds are recognised when the donation is known and approved.
